



**Rosary Crest** - Rosary's crest presents the school's philosophy in visual form. The sun symbolizes growth — spiritual, intellectual, emotional, and physical. The open hand characterizes a student's readiness to receive knowledge and to give to others. The cross is the traditional symbol of Christ and the letter "M", symbolic of Mary, is superimposed on the cross to signify that the pattern of our life is a journey toward Christ through Mary, the patroness of Rosary.



**Alumnae** - Rosary's Alumnae Association is a network of over 6,000 graduates.



Tri-School Theatre, a distinguished performing arts program, that trains students on and off stage.





**Athletics** - Athletics are an integral part of the Rosary community. 70% of the school participates in the athletic program and

**Campus History** - Rosary was founded in September 1965 under the auspices of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and administered by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange to provide greater opportunity for girls to attend a Catholic secondary school. There were 54 women in the first graduating class!
